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History of American Brown Ale. As with all the beer styles with “American” tacked on the front, (i.e. American IPA, American Pale, American Sour) this style is inextricably rooted in European brewing history. It has two brothers. Both of them English, and the roots stretch back to the 1700s when porters and stouts were popular in England and were often referred to as brown ales.

The style of beer that was to become known as “brown ale” can be traced back to the English brewers of the early 1700s. Brewing had existed in England for several centuries, but the output was mostly for home or local consumption and varied widely. By the 1720s there were dark beers being brewed in London that were called porters.
