Natural history of dementia Olson (2003) classifies dementia into four functionally defined categories: mild, moderate, severe, and terminal. ‘ Terminal dementia ’ is defined as loss of communication, ambulation, swallowing, and continence.

A person in this last stage of dementia requires a significant amount of care. Assistance and supervision is required 24 hours per day. Dementia patients may require assistance getting in and out of bed, moving from the bed to a chair, or may be bedridden and require help changing positions to avoid bedsores.

Seven Stages of Dementia - Dementia Care Central

(B) Behavioral and psychologic symptoms of dementia (BPSD) are a major source of caregiver burden and a frequent reason for seeking emergency care. Apathy, depression, personality changes, aggression, and resistance to care. Sleep cycle disturbances. Psychotic symptoms (suspicion, paranoia, delusions, hallucinations).

Assessment of Dementia Patients in ... - Geriatric Fast Facts

Few studies have looked at efficacy in moderate to severe dementia, which limits the applicability of ChEIs to patients who qualify for hospice based on dementia. Some studies have suggested ChEIs have a role in controlling behavior problems (2) and lessening opioid related somnolence (3).
