Ovarian teratomas include mature cystic teratomas (dermoid cysts), immature teratomas, and monodermal teratomas (eg, struma ovarii, carcinoid tumors, neural tumors). Most mature cystic teratomas can be diagnosed at ultrasonography (US) but may have a variety of appearances, characterized by echogenic sebaceous material and calcification.

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Ovarian teratomas are GCTs composed of mature or immature tissues derived from more than one of the three primitive embryonic layers (ectoderm, mesoderm, and endoderm). Mature Cystic Teratoma.— MCT, often called dermoid cyst when the ectodermal elements predominate, is the most common ovarian tumor in children and adolescents, accounting for approximately 50% of all pediatric ovarian neoplasms.
