The uterine cervix is the site for several infective pathologies that can be both bacterial like those caused by Candida albicans, Neisserie gonorrhoeae, Chlamydia and Mycoplasma, or viral like those caused by Herpes simplex, Cytomegalovirus and Papilloma virus.

An increasing number of cervical neoplasia studies implicate human papillomavirus (HPV) in the carcinogenic process, perhaps as a necessary factor but not the sole factor. Many different HPV types infect the cervix and the pattern of types is complex, even in women with a normal cervix or a low-grade cervical intraepithelial neoplasia lesion.

Pathology of the uterus | Radiology Key

Portio supravaginalis: anatomic portion of cervix superior to vaginal reflection Ectocervix (exocervix): external mucosal surface of portio vaginalis Normally lined by nonkeratinizing stratified squamous epithelium Endocervix (endocervical canal): mucosa lined cylindrical canal leading from ectocervix to uterine cavity

Pathology Outlines - Histology

Essential features. Can be pure undifferentiated endometrial carcinoma (UEC) or associated with a better differentiated endometrial carcinoma component: dedifferentiated endometrial carcinoma. Frequently involves the lower uterine segment or the cervix and usually presents with advanced stage. Predominant dyscohesive monotonous medium to large sized cells, with complete absence of glandular differentiation.

Pathology Outlines - Undifferentiated / dedifferentiated ...

- uterine cervix with parakeratosis, acanthosis, chronic inflammation, and focal ulceration associated with granulation tissue formation. - PARTIALLY CYSTIC NONPROLIFERATIVE ENDOMETRIUM. - UTERINE CORPUS WITH LEIOMYOMA.

Uterine prolapse - Libre Pathology

Circumscribed carcinoma of the uterine cervix was described in 1977 by Hasumi and associates. 118 In their study, the tumors were characterized by solid cords of cells with neither squamous nor glandular differentiation, surrounded by a dense lymphocytic infiltrate, which occasionally contained a considerable number of eosinophils and plasma cells. The tumor cells were fairly monomorphic, with large nuclei, one or more nucleoli, and clear to eosinophilic, granular cytoplasm.

10. Normal anatomy of cervix • The cervix is the lower end of the uterus. • In the adult, the cervical and endocervical region comprises 1/3 of the length of the uterus. • The outer cervix is lined by a stratified squamous mucosa containing abundant glycogen.

Clinical and histomorphological differential diagnoses of benign schwannomas of the uterine cervix include palisaded leiomyoma, angiomylfibroblastoma, desmoplastic melanoma, and neurofibroma : IHC analysis plays an important role in the diagnosis.
